

## EDITORIAL NOTES

Policy in editing was dictated primarily by finances. With reports for two years to publish and but little money in the treasury at the beginning of the year, it seemed necessary to hold down publishing expense to the minimum.

In conforming to this policy interesting but not necessarily essential discussion (in the editor's opinion) was deleted from some papers that occupy less than the four printed pages allowed articles by the society. Articles over four pages in length were necessarily cut down, except in cases where the author assumed the overrun charge.

In editing the general policy was to delete sentences or paragraphs rather than to rewrite. Minor changes in wording, punctuation, paragraphing, etc., were made at the editor's judgment to secure uniform usage and form throughout the report.

"Fun and Fact" paragraphs were used to facilitate make-up and to direct attention to a few of the humorous and worth while thoughts expressed in the papers.

It is too much to hope that no errors were made in editing. It is hoped that the general editorial policy meets the approval of the members.—James R. Wiley, Secretary.
